## From the Principal continued...

### Great Results Guarantee

Last fortnight I celebrated the State Government announcement to directly pass on Federal Government funding to schools. In 2014 we will be receiving an additional \$160,026.00. Since that time we have been discussing how the expenditure of funding would work at our school and following is a breakdown of expected expenditure areas as our school continues its improvement agenda in delivering our goal of an Enriched Education for All.

\$45,000.00 - Continuing Success Coach Role – working with staff on explicit teaching strategies for Reading Comprehension.

\$55,000.00 - Increasing Teacher Aide support in the Early Years - to assist in the implementation of Literacy and Numeracy.

\$13,000.00 - Teacher Release – to develop Individual Support Plans for students to achieve National Minimum Standard.

\$19,000.00 - Providing enhanced Professional Development opportunities for Teachers.

\$28,026.00 - Purchasing resources to support Literacy and Numeracy in the Early Years.

### Student Resources – Books etc

Last fortnight I included a reminder of the need for parents to provide their students the necessary resources to fully participate at Bribie. We still have many students who do not have the required resources. To assist your class teachers will be sending home individual lists indicating what resource students still require. Local newsagents have the school booklist. Without items students cannot fully participate in the offered educational program, feel left out and can suffer negative thoughts around their education. If you are having difficulties, concerns or issues in providing resources please discuss these with your class teacher.

As well the school asks parents to pay two amounts to the school. Details of these payments are listed in the table below. Amounts differ per year level.

### Uniform and Dress Code: Personal Belongings—Mobile Phones, Scooters and Skateboards.

I would like to remind parents and students of the following processes for the above items at Bribie Island State School.

**Mobile Phones and Digital Devices**—Students who bring mobile phones and digital devices to school MUST leave these in the office for safe keeping. Under no circumstance is it permitted for students to have mobile phones or digital devices during the day.

**Scooters and Skateboards**—Should students bring scooters or skateboards to school they MUST store these items in the bike racks. It is a personal choice to bring such items to school and it is not the responsibility of the office or class teachers to store these items. Knowing such items are to be stored in the bike racks should inform the safety and security decision of whether to bring these items to school.

## Curriculum Corner With Mrs Aczel & Mrs Roebuck

### Learning Goals

This week class teachers met with Mrs Roebuck and Mrs Aczel to create Literacy and Numeracy Learning Goals for their students.

Learning goals help teachers and students know;

- What needs to be taught/ learned
- The criteria for learning success

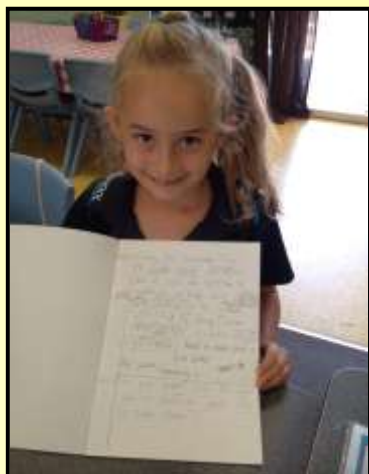
Students track their progress towards these goals and celebrate successes.

This term Literacy Learning Goals are as follows:

- Prep: Students will develop concepts about print, and apply these to early reading attempts.
- Year 1 Students will interpret emotions and feelings of characters in written picture books.
- Year 2 Students will demonstrate literal comprehension of text, locating specific information or events to support their understanding.
- Year 3 Students will read and comprehend a range of texts.
- Year 4 Students will analyse descriptive language in text, identifying language features and author intent.
- Year 5 Students will read and interpret a fantasy novel, demonstrating understanding author intent.
- Year 6 & Year 7 Students will draw on their own experiences, as well as details in text, to substantiate a point of view. Students will read and respond to short stories.

This term Numeracy Learning Goals are as follows:

- Prep: Students will understand, recognise and be able to count to the number 20.
- Year 1 Students will understand and represent numbers to 100 and Students will be able to count, partition and represent these numbers in various ways.
- Year 2 Students will interpret and perform simple addition and subtraction calculations and Students will be able to do this using a range of strategies.
- Year 3 Students will understand the value of 5 digit numbers and be able to represent these numbers in multiple ways.
- Year 4 Students will understand the value of digits in 4 digit numbers and Students will be able to work with 4 digit numbers in a range of multiplication and division situations.
- Year 5 Students will understand the importance of place value and Students will be able to solve simple operations
- Year 6 & Year 7 Students will recognise and understand the value and attributes of a number.
