

Code of School behaviour – For all

The school has an accepted Code of Behaviour which applies to all students, staff and volunteers when at school.

When parents enrol their children at school they do so under agreement to meet the schools Code of Behaviour. It applies to everyone. Unfortunately, as a school is a dynamic social learning environment, students at times make mistakes and break the accepted behaviour requiring an action to guide and support them for improvement. Sometimes this results in discipline being applied.

As well as the managing inappropriate behaviour our school operates an extensive reward and encouragement system.

At Bribie Island State School we use a system called One School to record and document incidents of students' who cannot comply with the school Code of Behaviour.

In analysing the Semester One 2013 data the following facts are apparent.

92% of students were recognised for the good efforts with a Spirit of Bribie award.

3% (20 of 667) students are responsible for 48.2% of all entries for inappropriate behaviour.

6% (40 of 667) students are responsible for 77.8% of all entries for inappropriate behaviour.

Of the 40 students most frequently recorded as behaving inappropriately, 8 are in years P – 3 and 32 are in years 4 – 7.

We want to change this data and take this opportunity to remind everyone of our school expectations.

Our school community has identified the following school rules to teach and promote our high standards of responsible behaviour:

- Be an Active Learner
- Be Safe
- Be Respectful.

Our school rules have been agreed upon and endorsed by all staff and our school P&C through the process of the School Wide Positive Behaviour Support (SWPBS) program. The key principles underlying the use of any practice are:

- Consistency;
- Follow through (i.e. completion);
- Rebuilding of relationships;
- Child involvement (i.e. co-construction of class rules);
- Personal Development programs (i.e. Student focused lessons, staff in-service and parent workshops).

Our Responsible Behaviour Plan outlines our system for facilitating positive behaviours, preventing problem behaviour and responding to unacceptable behaviours. We consider behaviour management to be an opportunity for valuable social learning as well as a means of maximising the success of academic education programs. Students of all ages and capabilities have the capacity to behave appropriately with adult and peer support. Individuals who interact successfully exhibit the following qualities:-

- Persistence,
- Getting Along,
- Confidence,
- Organisation and
- Emotional Resilience.

Rights and Responsibilities

We believe that through facilitating positive behaviours, preventing problem behaviours and responding to unacceptable behaviours we uphold the rights and responsibilities of all members of the Bribie Island State School community

“The child is the focus of our school”

Bribie Island State School's Responsible Behaviour Plan provides the structure and clear guidelines required to encourage a positive school tone and a supportive school environment. We put this plan in place to ensure that all members of our school community are safe and have the potential to develop as life-long learners. This plan is supported and acknowledged on enrolment by our *Enrolment Agreement*.

The plan respects the following rights:

- The rights of all students to learn
- The rights of teachers to teach
- The rights of all to be safe

In order for students to achieve their full potential, the school insists all its members feel safe and valued and behave towards each other in ways that are:

- respectful
- reasonable
- responsible
- supportive
- caring and considerate
- dignified



Celebrations for our upcoming Literacy and Numeracy Week with 300 new reading books for our school from Busy Fingers




